WHAT IS A SEED LIBRARY?

The Livonia Seed Library is a free program committed to increasing our ability to feed ourselves wholesome food by offering seeds and education.

Through the time-honored tradition of seed saving we celebrate biodiversity, nurture locally adapted plant varieties, foster community resilience, self-reliance, and a culture of sharing.

The Livonia Seed Library operates on the honor system. You become a member automatically when you withdraw seeds to plant.

We encourage all members to learn basic seed-saving techniques. We ask that beginning seed savers try to grow out and return seeds from plants such as tomatoes, beans, or peas the first year.

If you are unable to save your own seed, please consider donating a packet or two of fresh, commercially grown, open-pollinated (nonhybrid, nonGMO) seed to keep our library stocked.
