

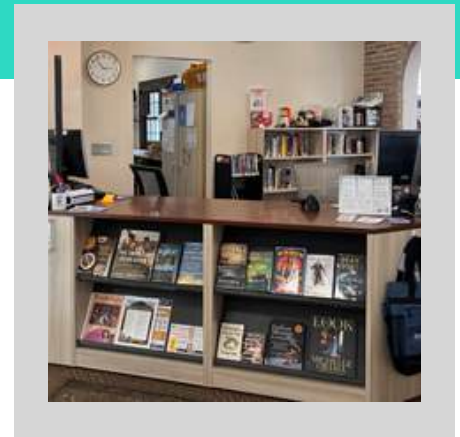


DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Adult Services

In March, Schlinger expanded adult and senior programming with a diverse mix of lectures, digital literacy sessions, book discussions, and social events, including a well-attended AARP Driver Safety Course. Community response was very positive, with strong attendance and engagement across both new and recurring programs. Overall, participation trends highlight the continued demand for accessible, high-quality experiences that support learning, independence, and social connection.



CHILDREN'S SERVICES

In March, Wednesday Wonderlab hosted an interactive mystery where children solved The Case of the Missing Mailbox Monster through clues and exploration. An engaging Nutrition Month display and a child-created St. Patrick's Day book display added hands-on learning and creativity to the space. Girl Scout Troop 51108 partnered with the library to select If You Plant a Seed for the season's first StoryWalk. New after-school "pop-up" programs included crafts, Lego-building, and an egg hunt. Tales with Toby also expanded into a flexible, drop-in storytime encouraging children to read and participate.



In March, Shamika focused on strengthening and onboarding the YA position, welcoming Connor Marsland to the team, while also attending a DocuWare presentation and identifying a financial charge error. Work began on summer reading planning, participation in the Geneseo Farmers Market was secured, and a plan was developed for the new Arc GLOW intern. Additionally, the library acquired passes to the George Eastman Museum for patron use and hosted a Women's History Month exhibit provided by RRLC. Octavia Butler was featured as our 1st Black 365 exhibit in March.
